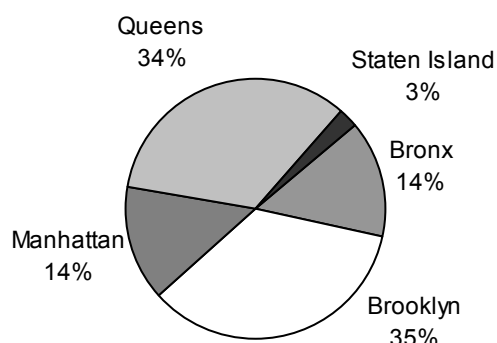


Chapter 12. Immigration*

New York City has long been one of the primary destinations for immigrants entering the United States. As displayed in Borough Table 12-1 and according to the New York City Housing and Vacancy Survey (HVS)¹, New York City contained 1,010,324 foreign-born households in 2002 (33.6% of the City's total households)². The highest percentages of immigrant households were in Queens (43.5%) and Brooklyn (40.2%), followed by the Bronx (31.3%), Manhattan (20.3%) and Staten Island (15.9%) (Borough Table 12-1).

Three out of the five sub-borough areas with the highest number of foreign-born households were in Queens: Flushing/Whitestone (37,851), Astoria (35,407) and Jackson Heights (30,462); Manhattan's Washington Heights/Hamilton Heights (34,381) and Brooklyn's Bensonhurst (31,896) also had two of the highest numbers of immigrant households. Sub-borough areas with the lowest number of immigrant households spanned

four of the five boroughs, including Throgs Neck/Co-op City in the Bronx (6,745), Greenwich Village/Financial District in Manhattan (7,107), Park Slope/Carroll Gardens in Brooklyn (7,323), and Mid-Island (7,338) and South Shore (7,515) in Staten Island (Exhibit 12-1).

Looking at the percentage of immigrants in total population across sub-borough areas, a slightly different picture emerges. Immigrant percentages are, like immigrant numbers, highest in Brooklyn and Queens sub-borough areas, however, most of the five areas with the highest percentages - East

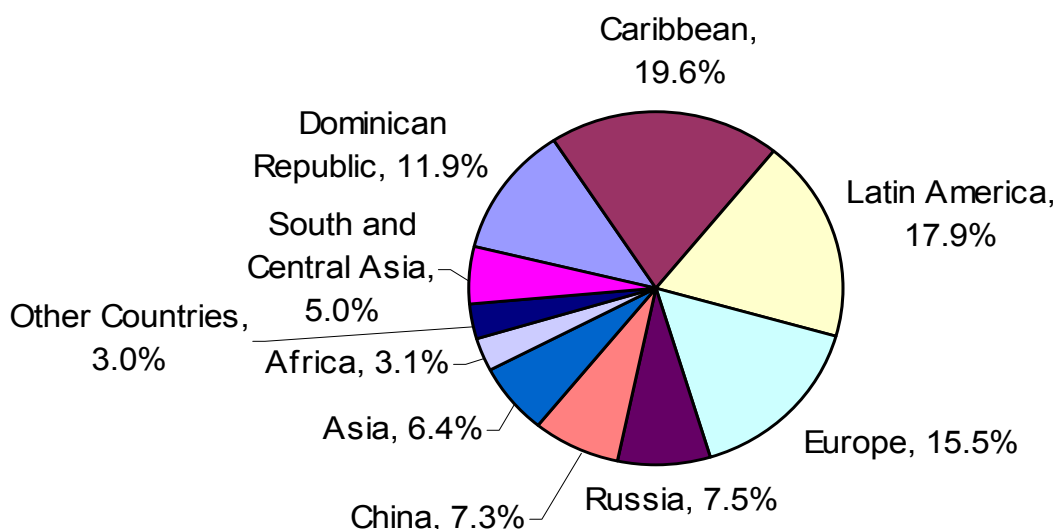

Flatbush (60.9%) and Coney Island (55.9%) in Brooklyn, and Elmhurst/Corona (59.3%) and Sunnyside/Woodside (52.0%) in Queens - are not among the five sub-boroughs with the highest numbers. And, the sub-borough areas with the lowest immigrant percentages are less dispersed across boroughs than the areas with the lowest numbers. Three of the sub-boroughs with the lowest immigrant percentages are in Manhattan: Stuyvesant Town/Turtle-Bay (13.9%), Upper East Side (12.2%), and Greenwich Village/Financial District (10.9%) (Exhibit 12-2).

Among all foreign-born households residing in New York City in 2002, the largest number came from the Caribbean (not including Puerto Rico and the Dominican Republic) (198,378 people, 6.6%). Other areas contributing large numbers of immigrant households include

Europe (156,957, 5.2%), Central and South America (153,127, 5.1%), the Dominican Republic (119,971, 4.0%), Russia/Successor States to the Soviet Union (76,047, 2.5%), China, Hong Kong and Taiwan (73,807, 2.5%), Africa (31,304, 1.0%), Pakistan and Bangladesh (29,549, 1.0%), and Mexico (27,245, 0.9%) (Borough Table 12-2).

The boroughs demonstrated a range of immigrant household populations, with the most diversity occurring in Queens and the least in Staten Island. Queens had a substantial percentage of foreign-born households from Central and South America (10.4%), Europe (7.4%), the Caribbean (7.3%), China, Hong Kong and Taiwan (3.3%), Korea (2.1%), and Pakistan and Bangladesh (2.1%). Brooklyn also housed a number of immigrant households, such as those from the Caribbean (11.8%), Russia/Successor States to the Soviet Union (6.1%), Europe (5.9%), and China, Hong Kong and Taiwan (2.8%). The Bronx exhibited the highest percentage of immigrant households from the Dominican Republic (9.7%), as well as notably sized group of foreign-born households from Mexico (1.2%) and Africa (2.1%). Manhattan had a slightly larger number of immigrant households from China, Hong Kong and Taiwan (2.9%) than the Bronx, but a lower percentage of foreign-born households from the Dominican Republic (5.4%) (Borough Table 12-2).

Among sub-borough areas, foreign-born households from the Dominican Re-

public most often settled in Manhattan and the Bronx: Washington Heights/Inwood (24,822) and Morningside Heights/Hamilton (6,860) in Manhattan, and University Heights/Fordham (8,731), Highbridge/South Concourse (8,666) and Kingsbridge Heights/Mosholu (6,732) in the Bronx (Exhibit 12-3).

Neighborhoods with the highest number of foreign-born households from the Caribbean were in East Flatbush (25,588), Flatlands/Canarsie (15,781) and South Crown Heights (14,148) in Brooklyn, and Queens Village (17,016) and Jamaica (15,360) in Queens (Exhibit 12-4).

Similarly, neighborhoods with the highest number of foreign-born households from Mexico were mostly situated in Brooklyn and Queens: Sunset Park (2,310) and Bushwick (1,726) in Brooklyn, and Elmhurst/Corona (1,781) and Jackson Heights (1,510) in Queens. Morrisania/Belmont in the Bronx also had one of the highest representations of immigrants from Mexico (1,323) (Exhibit 12-5).

Foreign-born households from Europe also settled in Queens, mainly in the neighborhoods of Astoria (12,389) and Middle Village/Ridgewood (11,962). Europeans also moved to neighborhoods in Brooklyn: Williamsburg/Greenpoint (10,737), Bensonhurst (8,811), and Borough Park (6,325) had some of the highest numbers of Europeans (Exhibit 12-6).

Four of the five neighborhoods with the highest number of foreign-born households from Russia/Successor States to the Soviet Union

were in Brooklyn, with the greatest number in Coney Island (16,607), followed by Sheepshead Bay/ Gravesend (12,654), Bensonhurst (8,612) and Borough Park (5,212). Rego Park/Forest Hills in Queens also housed a large number of these immigrant households (5,897) (Exhibit 12-7).

The highest number of foreign-born households from China, Hong Kong and Taiwan live in Manhattan's Lower East Side/Chinatown (13,798), followed by Flushing/Whitestone in Queens (8,683), Bensonhurst (8,039) and Sunset Park (6,681) in Brooklyn, and Bayside/Little Neck in Queens (3,806) (Exhibit 12-8).

When examining sub-borough areas for the foreign-born households from Korea, India and the Philippines, neighborhoods in Queens had the highest representation. For immigrant households from Korea, these neighborhoods included Flushing/Whitestone (5,771), Sunnyside/Woodside (3,603), Bayside/Littleneck (3,556), Elmhurst/Corona (1,143), and Middle Village/Ridgewood (1,076) (Exhibit 12-9). For foreign-born households from India, the most densely populated neighborhoods were: Ozone Park/Woodhaven (2,339), Flushing/Whitestone (2,193), Queens Village (1,670), Rego Park/Forest Hills (1,381), and Hillcrest/Fresh Meadows (1,218) (Exhibit 12-10). For the Philippines, the most foreign-born households were found in Hillcrest/Fresh Meadows (1,567), Sunnyside/Woodside (1,030), Elmhurst/Corona (972), Flushing/Whitestone

(933) and Astoria (891) (Exhibit 12-11).

Neighborhoods with the highest number of foreign-born households from Southeast Asia and other Asian countries were in three of the five boroughs. For immigrant households from Southeast Asia, the largest numbers were found in Jackson Heights (818), Flushing/Whitestone (723), Elmhurst/Corona (580) and Rego Park/Forest Hills (567) in Queens, and Pelham Parkway in the Bronx (576) (Exhibit 12-12). For those from other Asian countries, the households were concentrated in Queens – Rego Park/Forest Hills (1,568) and Astoria (1,285) – and Manhattan – the Upper West Side (1,428), Chelsea/Clinton/ Midtown (1,155) and the Upper East Side (1,154) (Exhibit 12-13).

Neighborhoods with the highest number of foreign-born households from Africa were University Heights/Fordham in the Bronx (2,696), followed by Jamaica in Queens (2,189), Soundview/Parkchester in the Bronx (2,108), North Shore in Staten Island (2,060) and Central Harlem in Manhattan (1,938) (Exhibit 12-14).

The largest number of foreign-born households from Central and South America resided in Queens: Jackson Heights (14,064), Astoria (8,664), Elmhurst/Corona (8,515), Jamaica (7,384) and Ozone Park/Woodhaven (7,264) (Exhibit 12-15). The highest number of immigrant households from Pakistan and Bangladesh were also found in Queens – Astoria (5,156), Sunnyside/Woodside (2,105) and Jackson Heights (2,065) - and in Brooklyn as well: Borough Park (2,872) and Flatbush (2,387) (Exhibit 12-16).

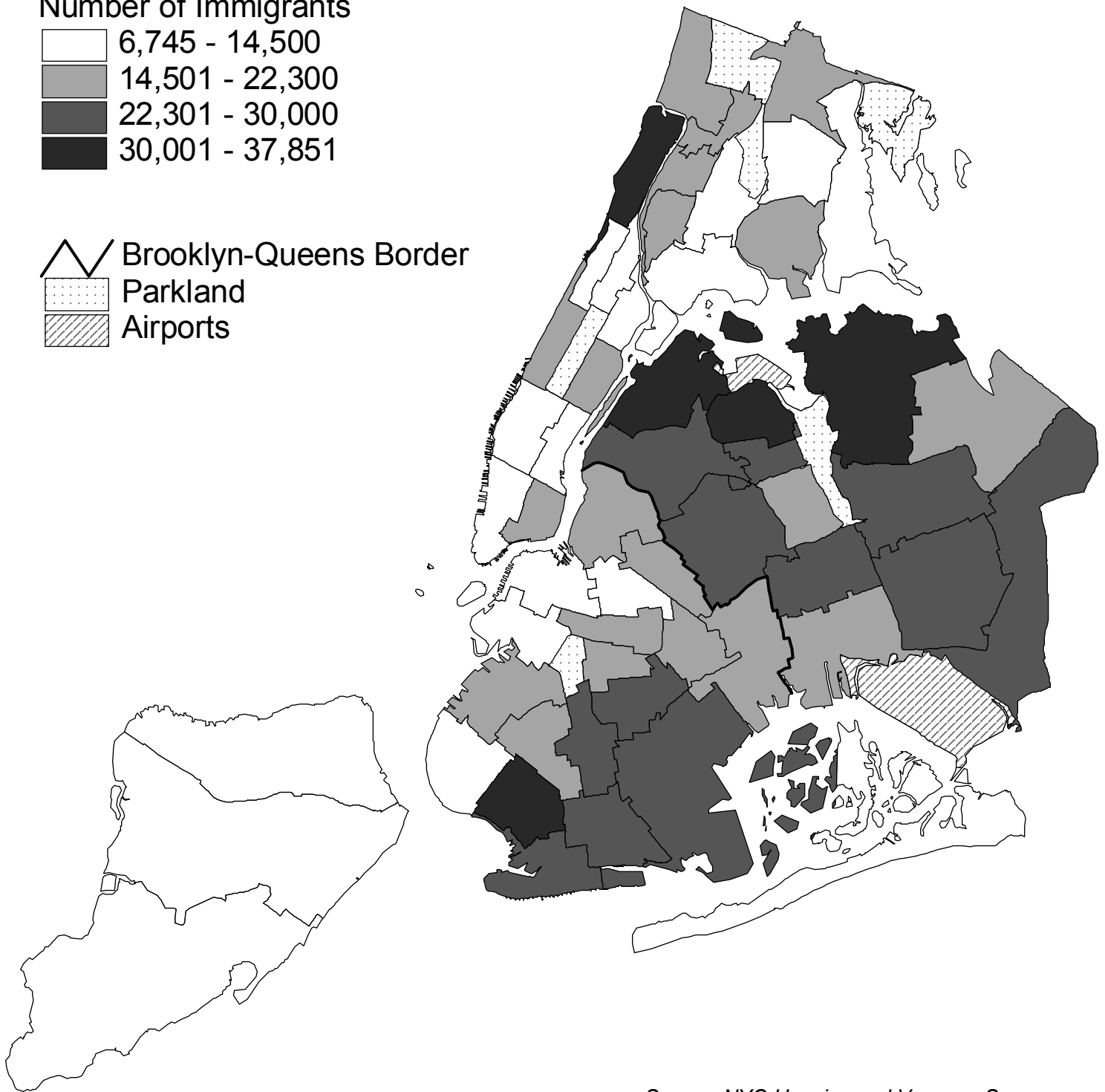
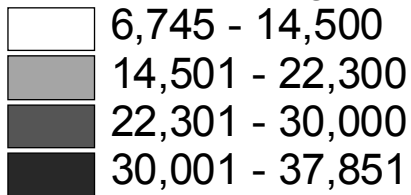

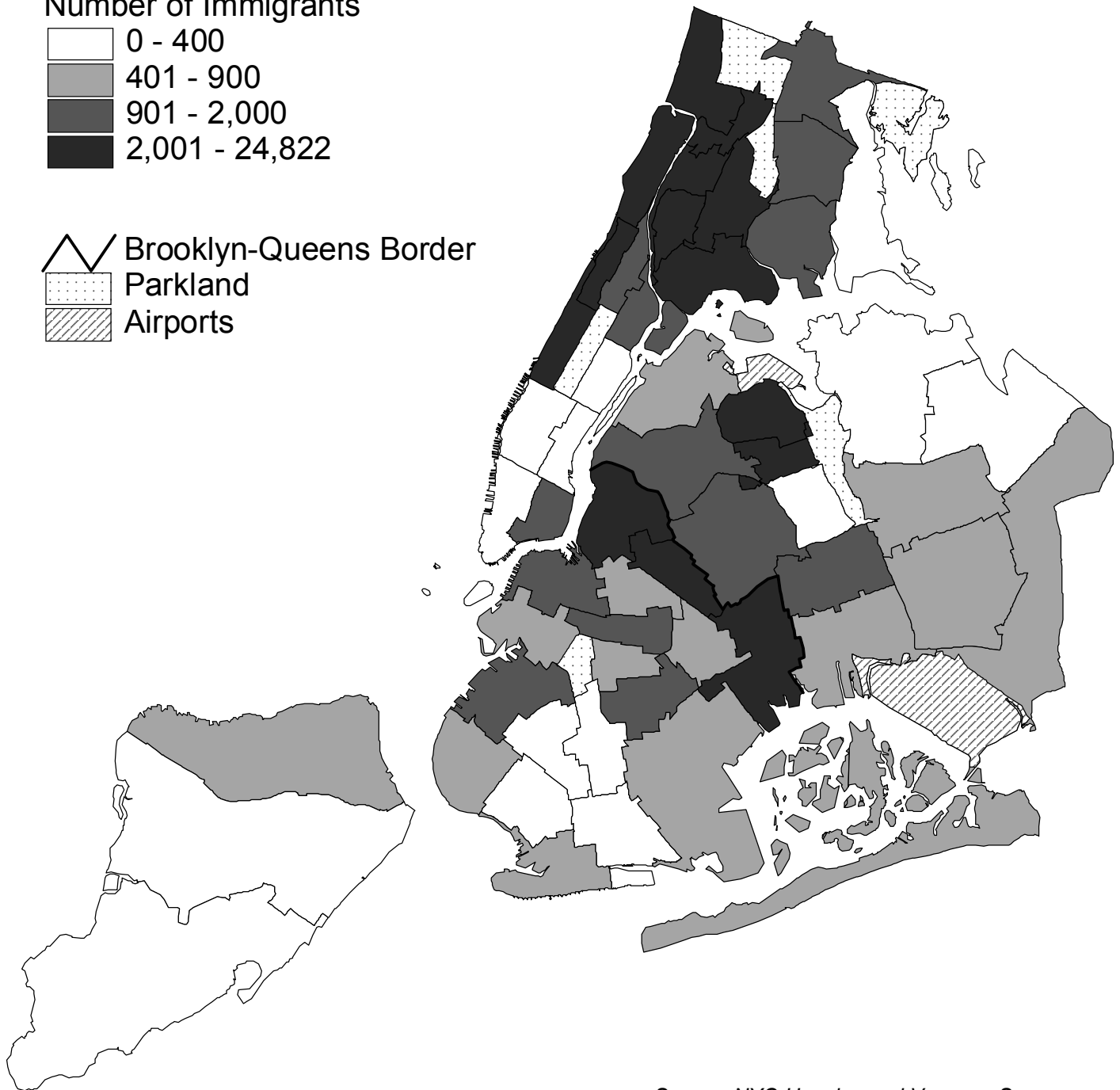

Number of Immigrant Households from the Dominican Republic in New York City Sub-borough Areas, 2002

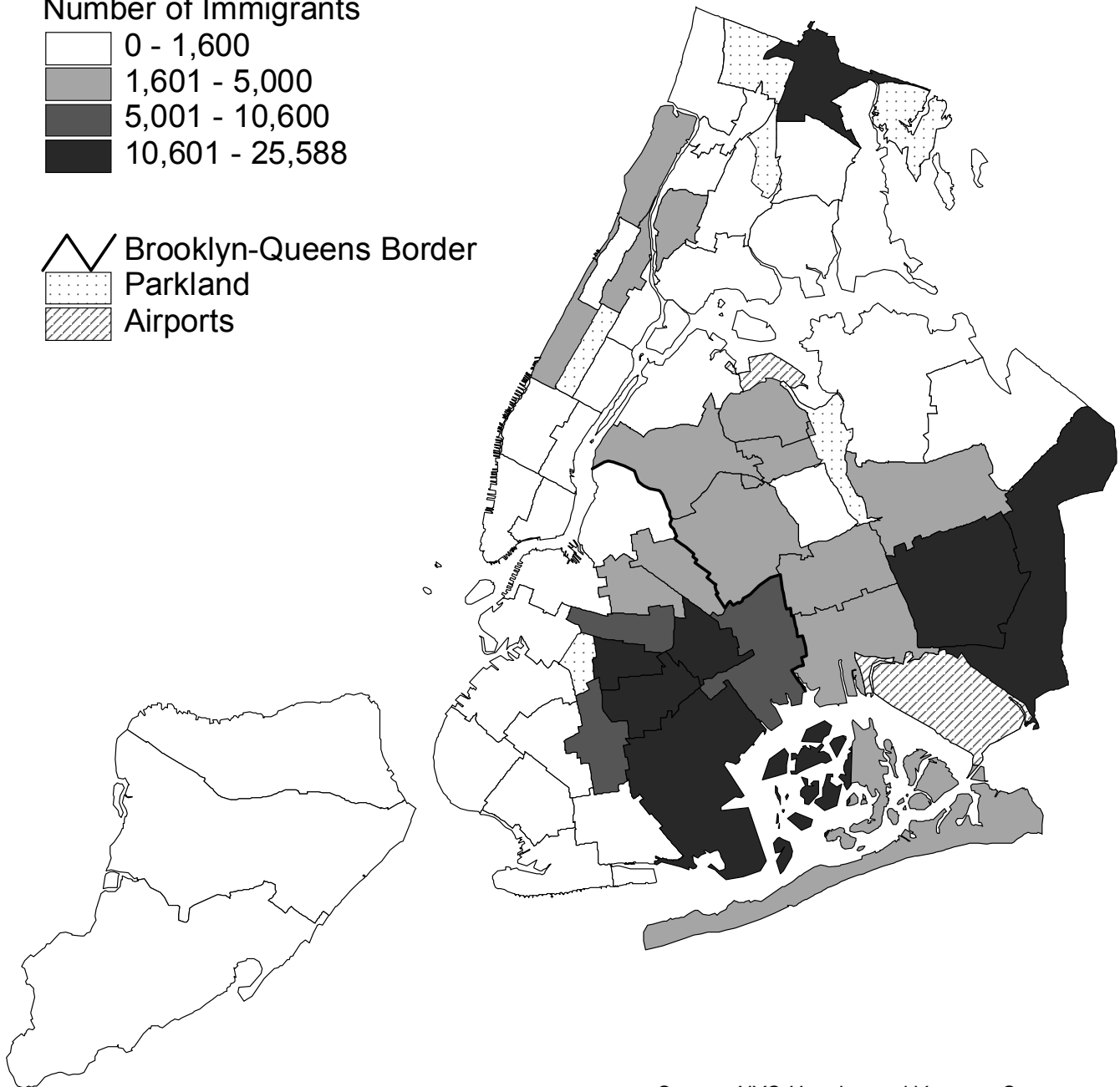
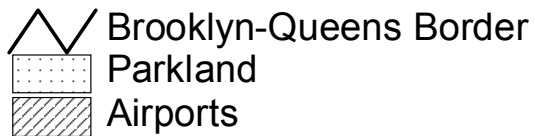
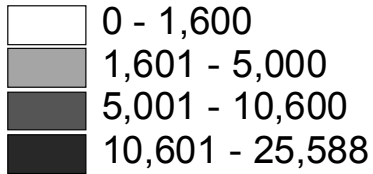

Map 12-4 **Number of Immigrant Households from the** **Caribbean in New York City Sub-borough Areas,** **2002**

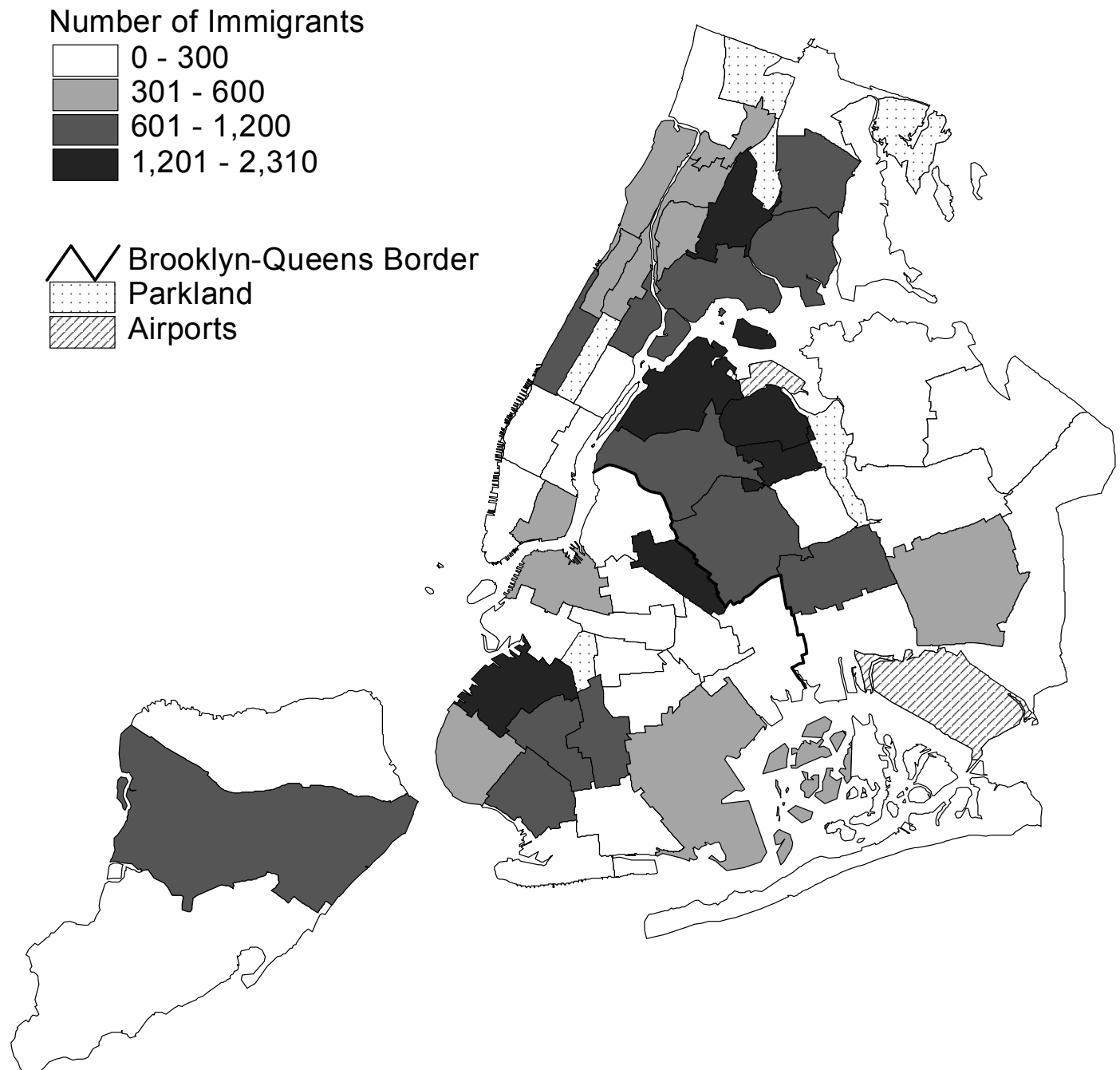

Number of Immigrant Households from Mexico in New York City Sub-borough Areas, 2002

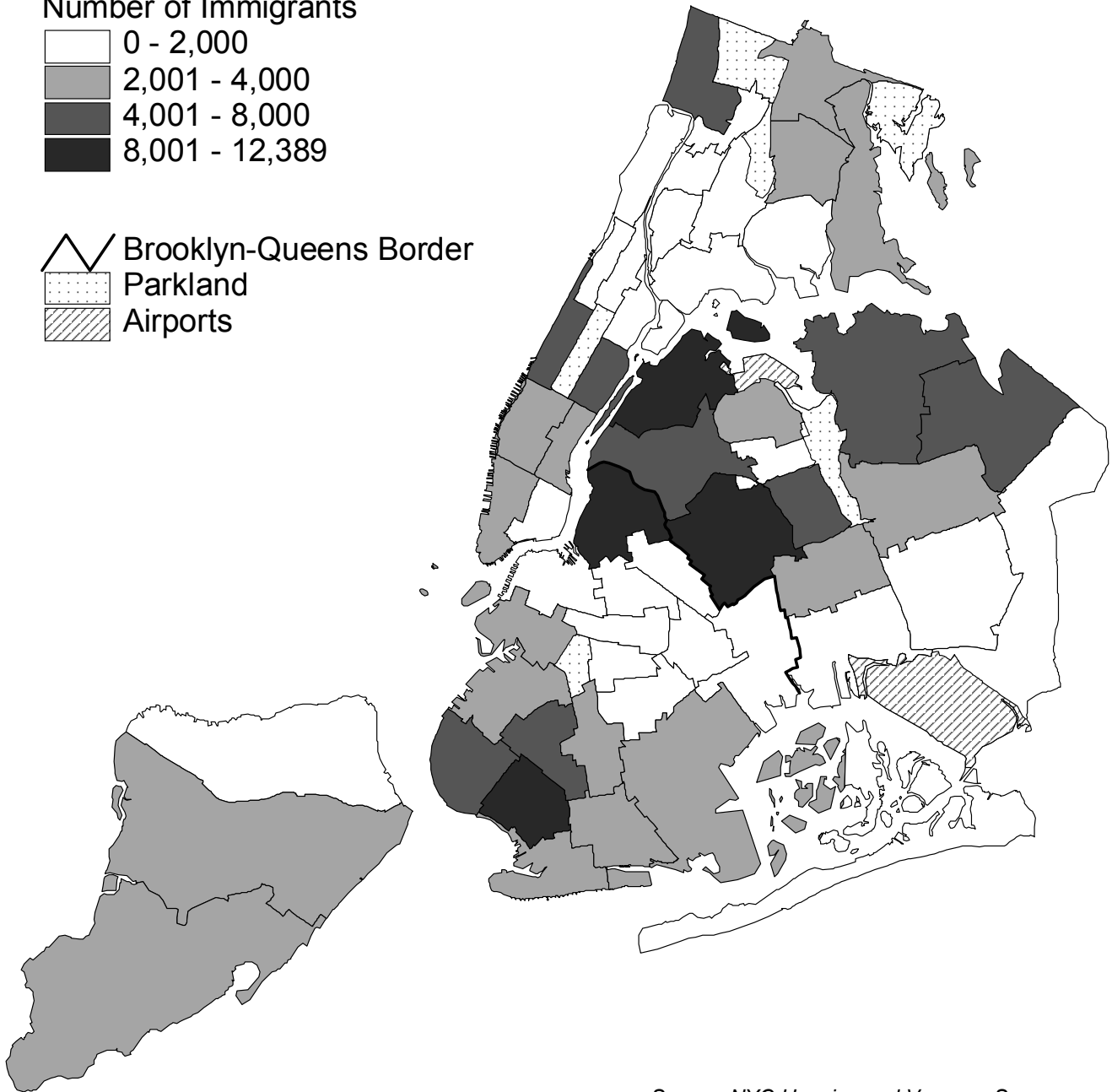
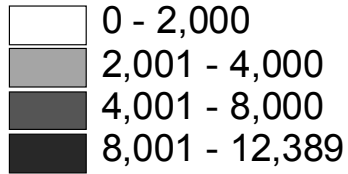

Number of Immigrant Households from Europe in New York City Sub-borough Areas, 2002

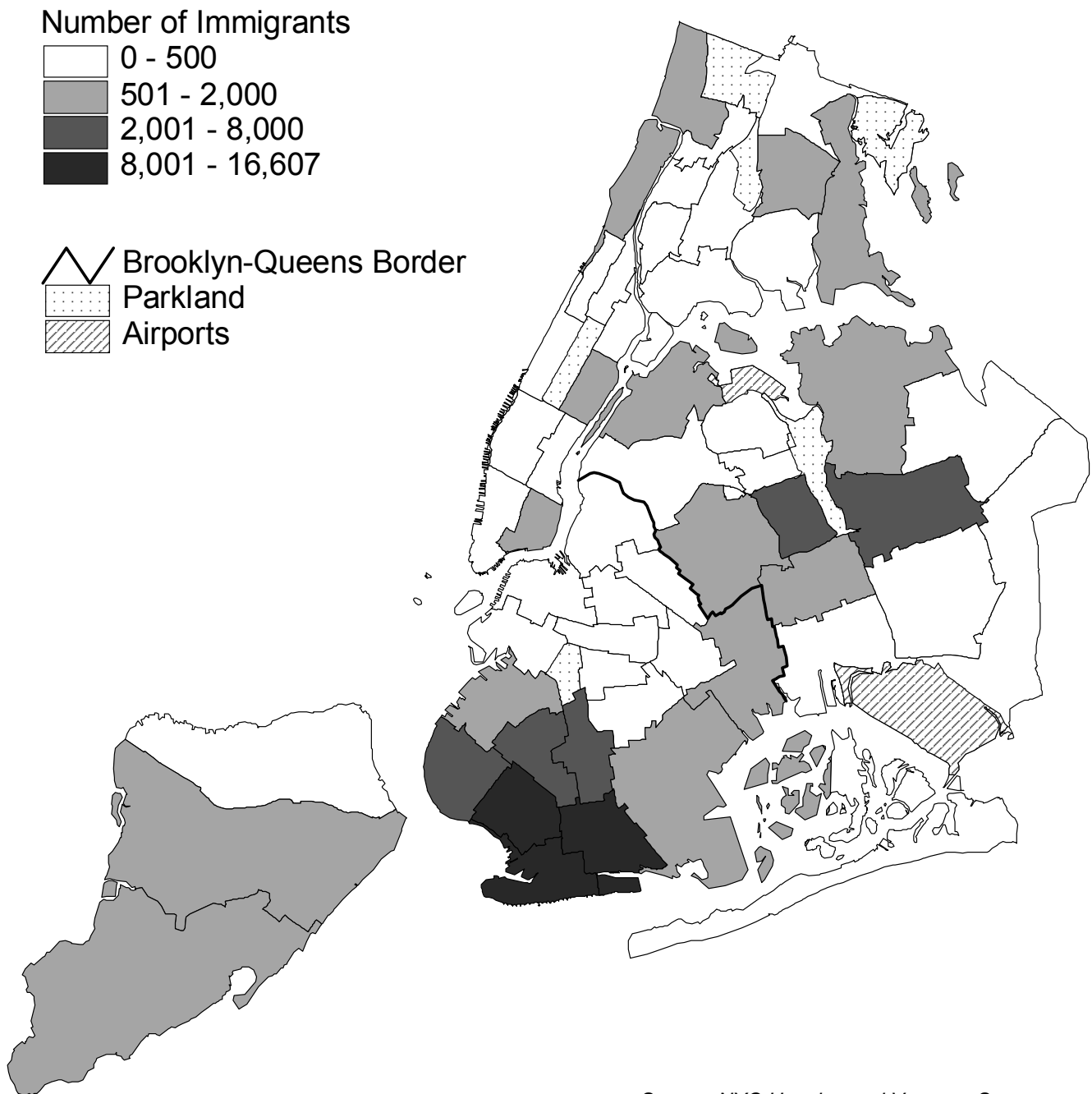

Number of Immigrant Households from Russia/Successor States to Soviet Union in New York City Sub-borough Areas, 2002

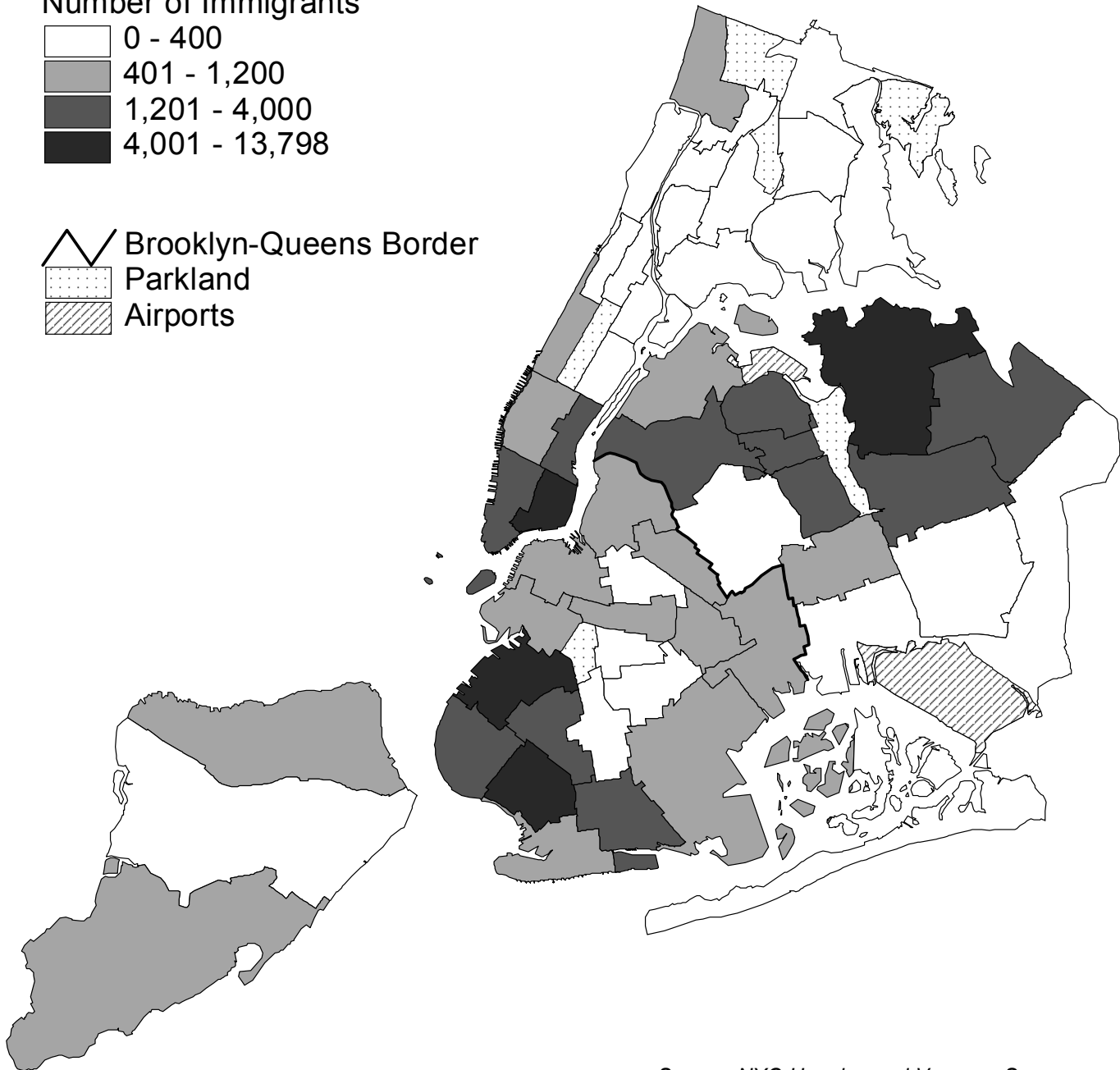
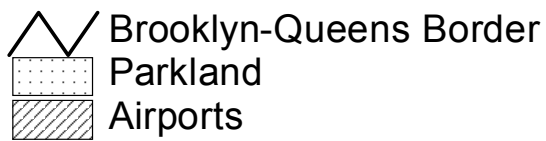
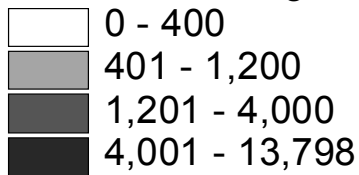

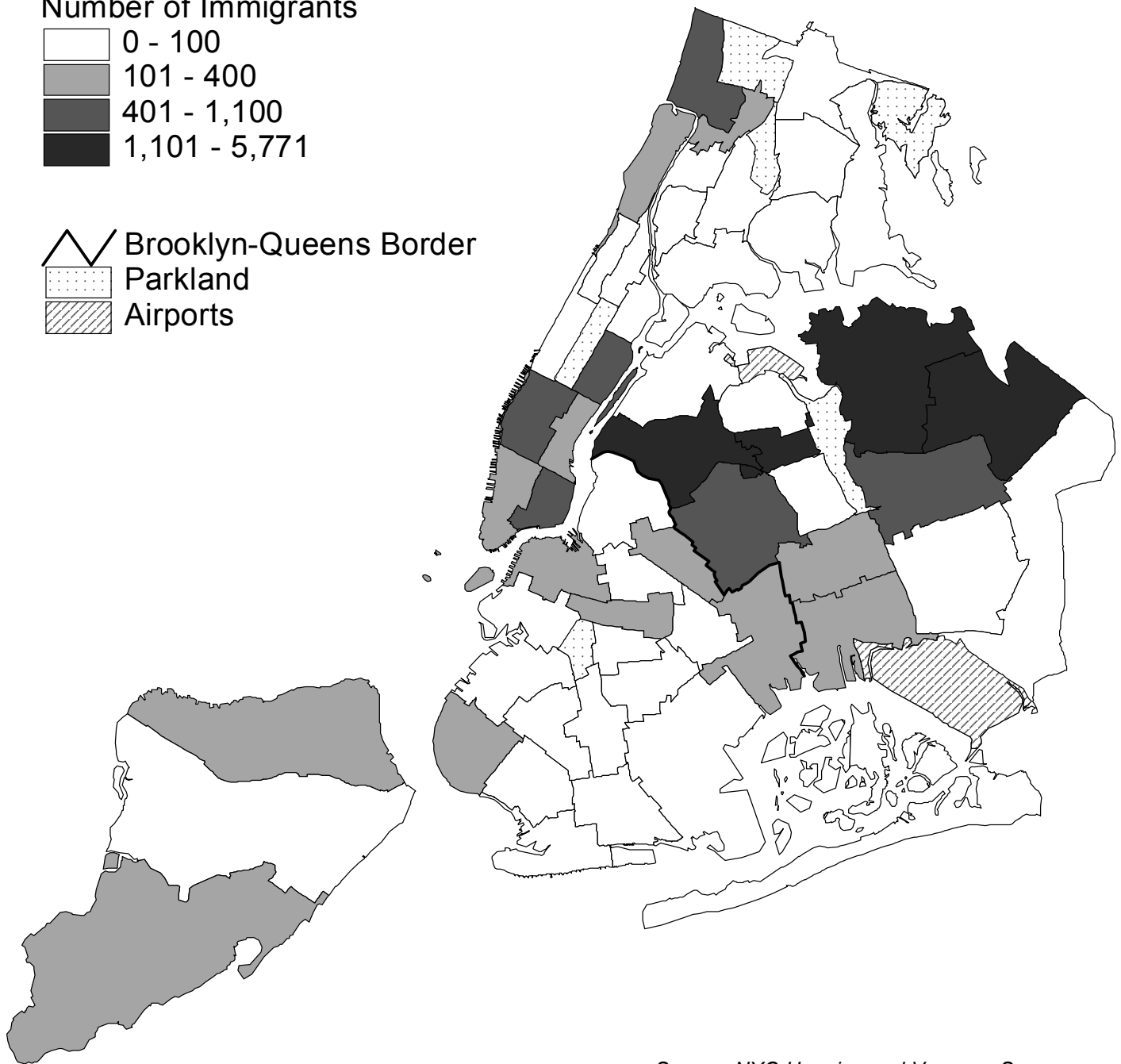

Number of Immigrant Households from Korea in New York City Sub-borough Areas, 2002

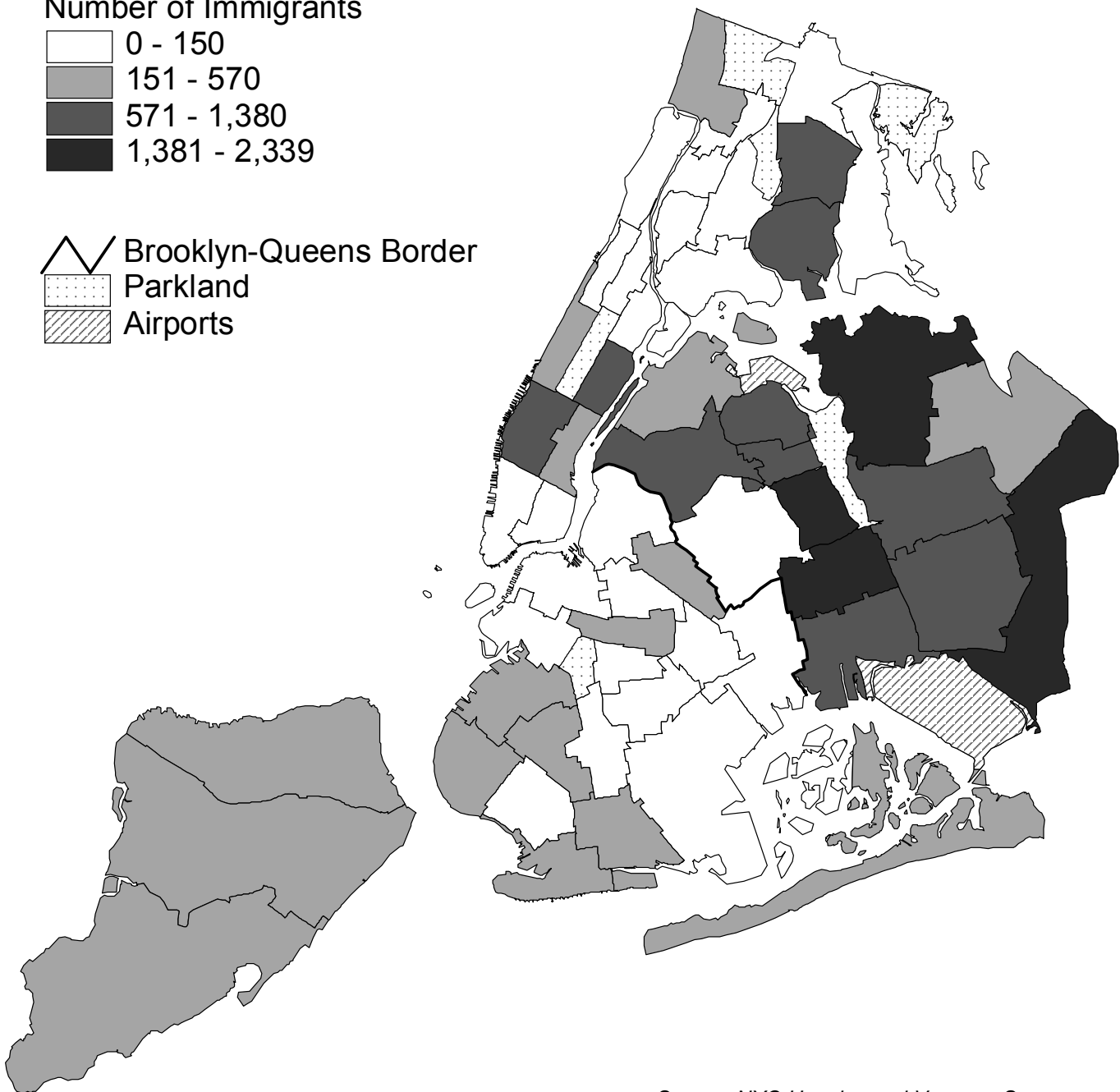
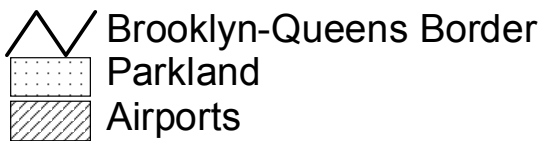
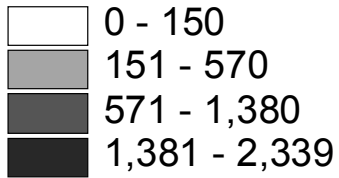

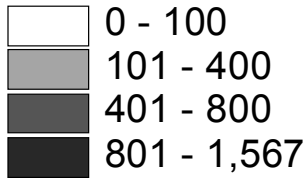

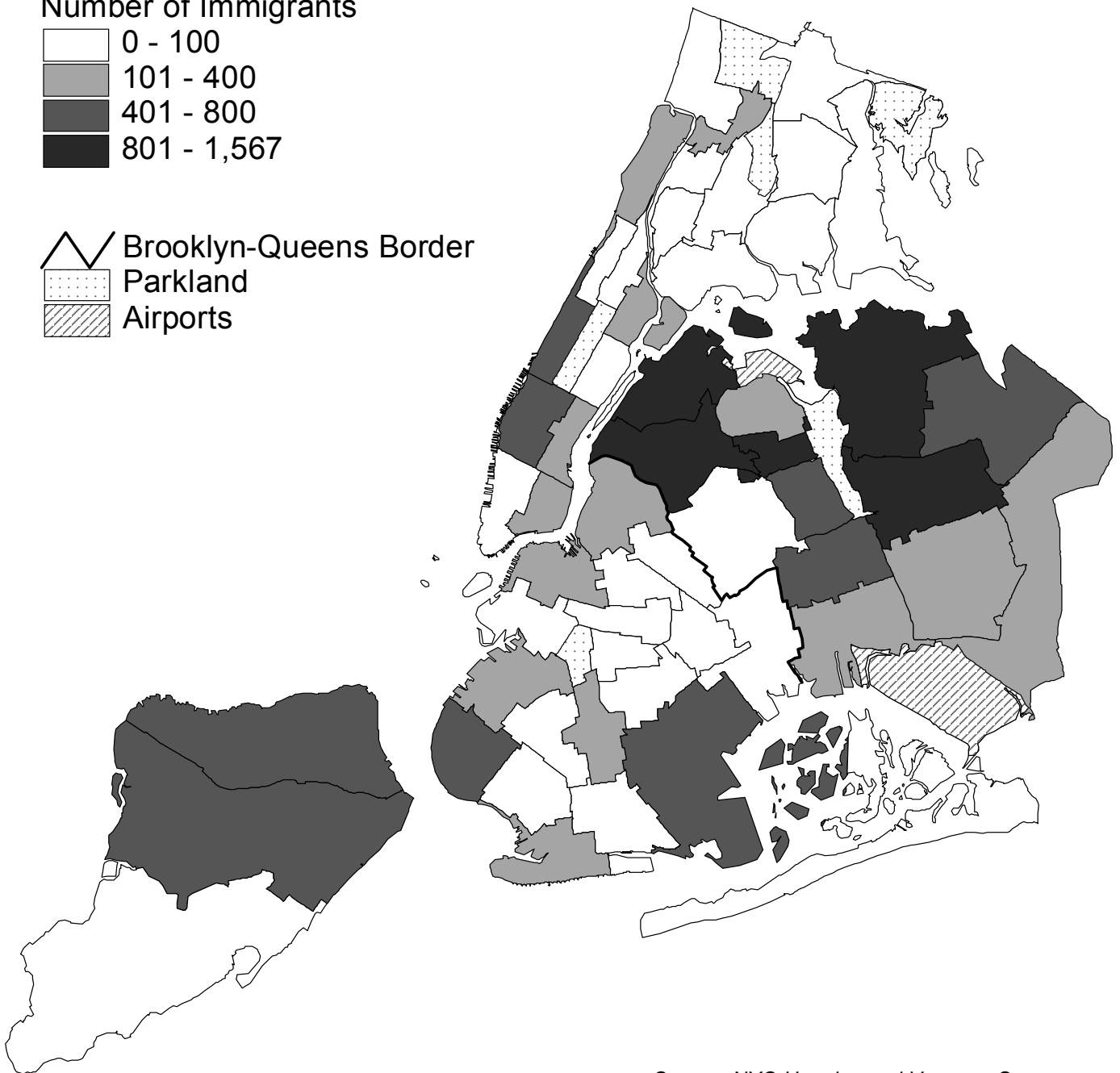

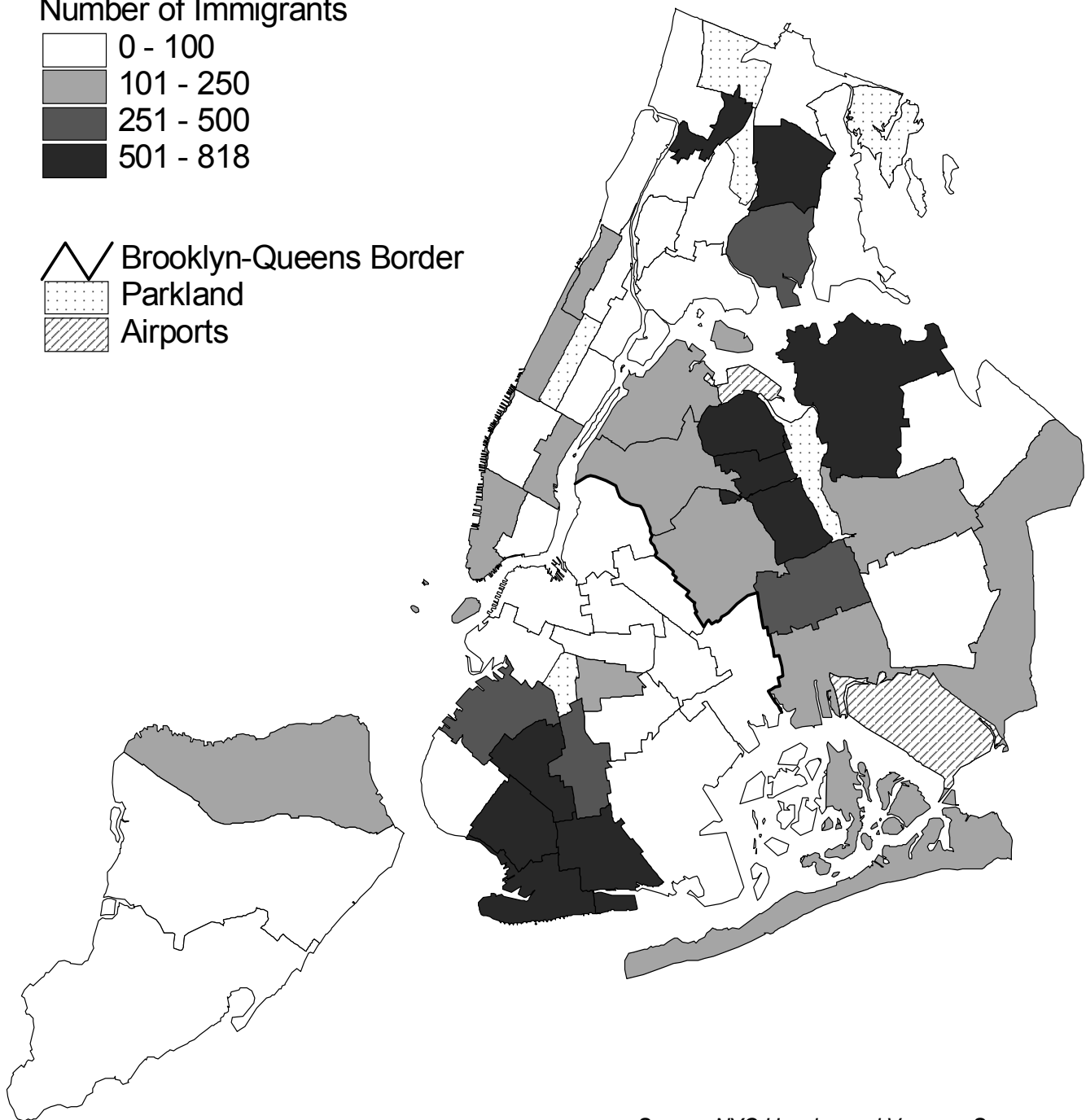

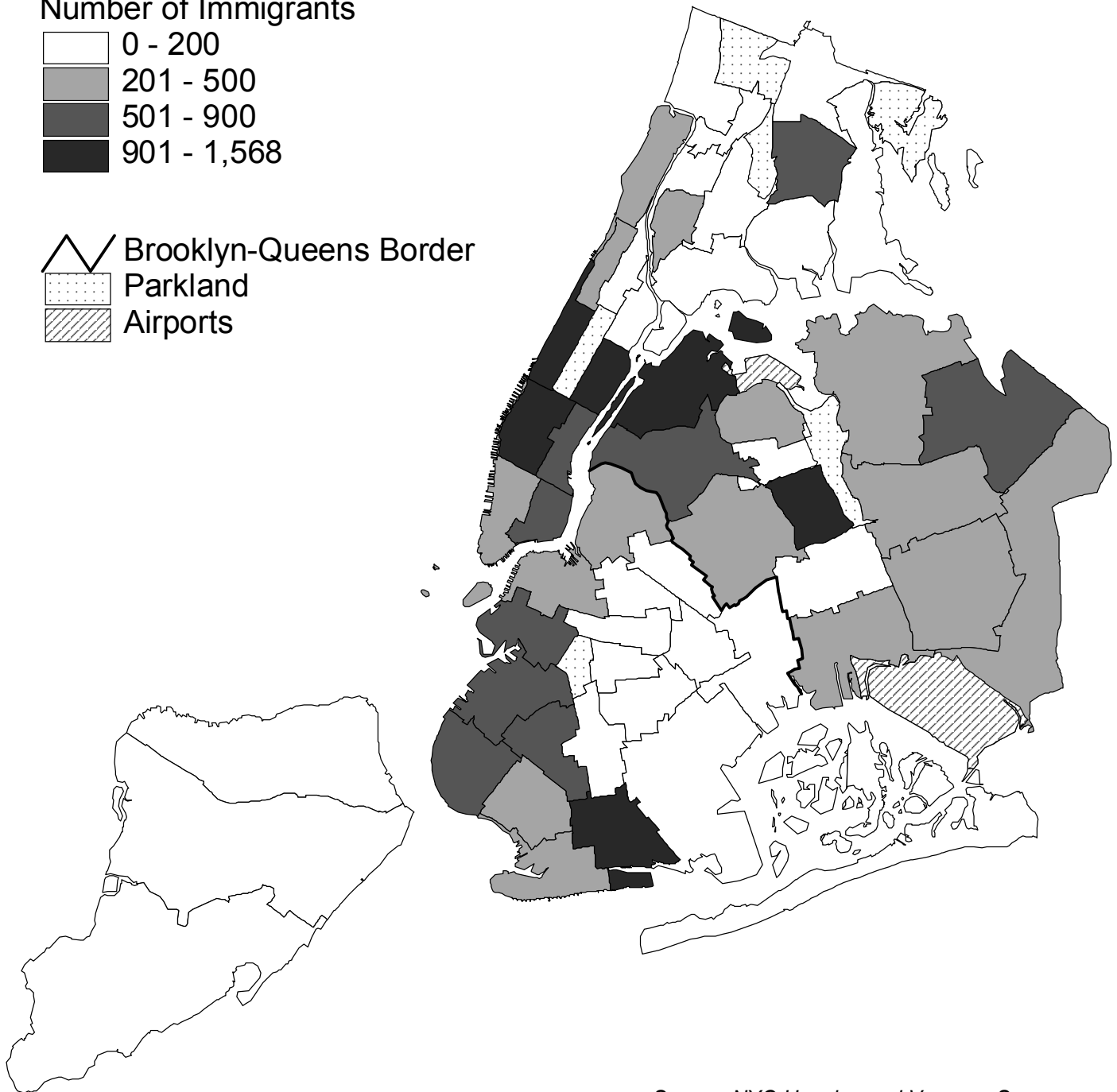
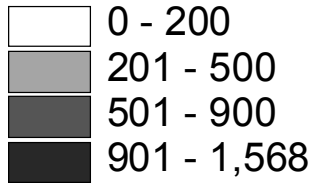

Number of Immigrant Households from Other Asia in New York City Sub-borough Areas, 2002

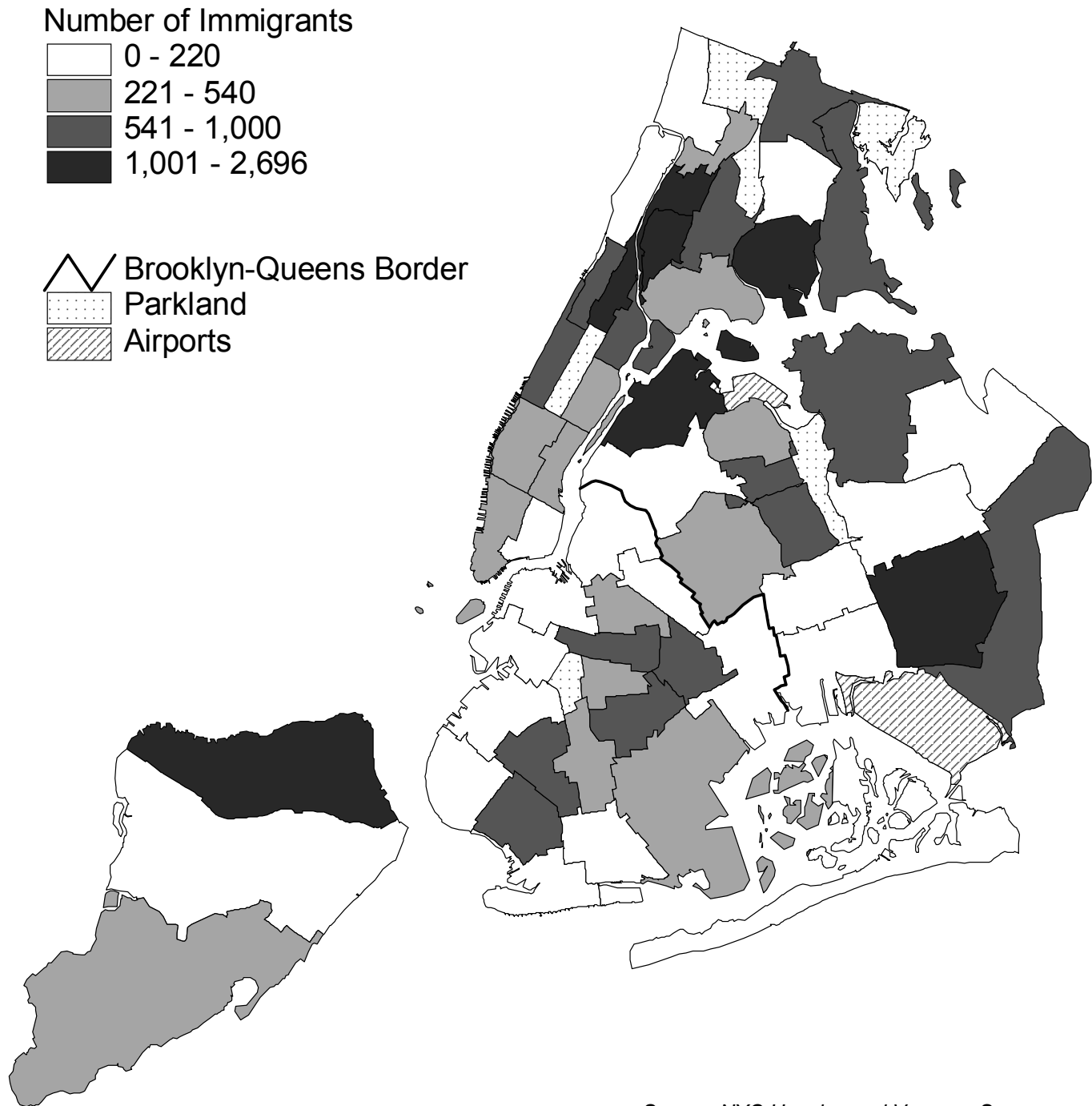

Number of Immigrant Households from Africa in New York City Sub-borough Areas, 2002

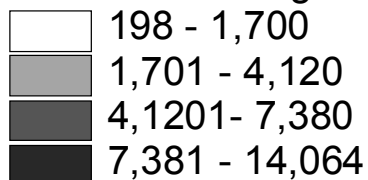

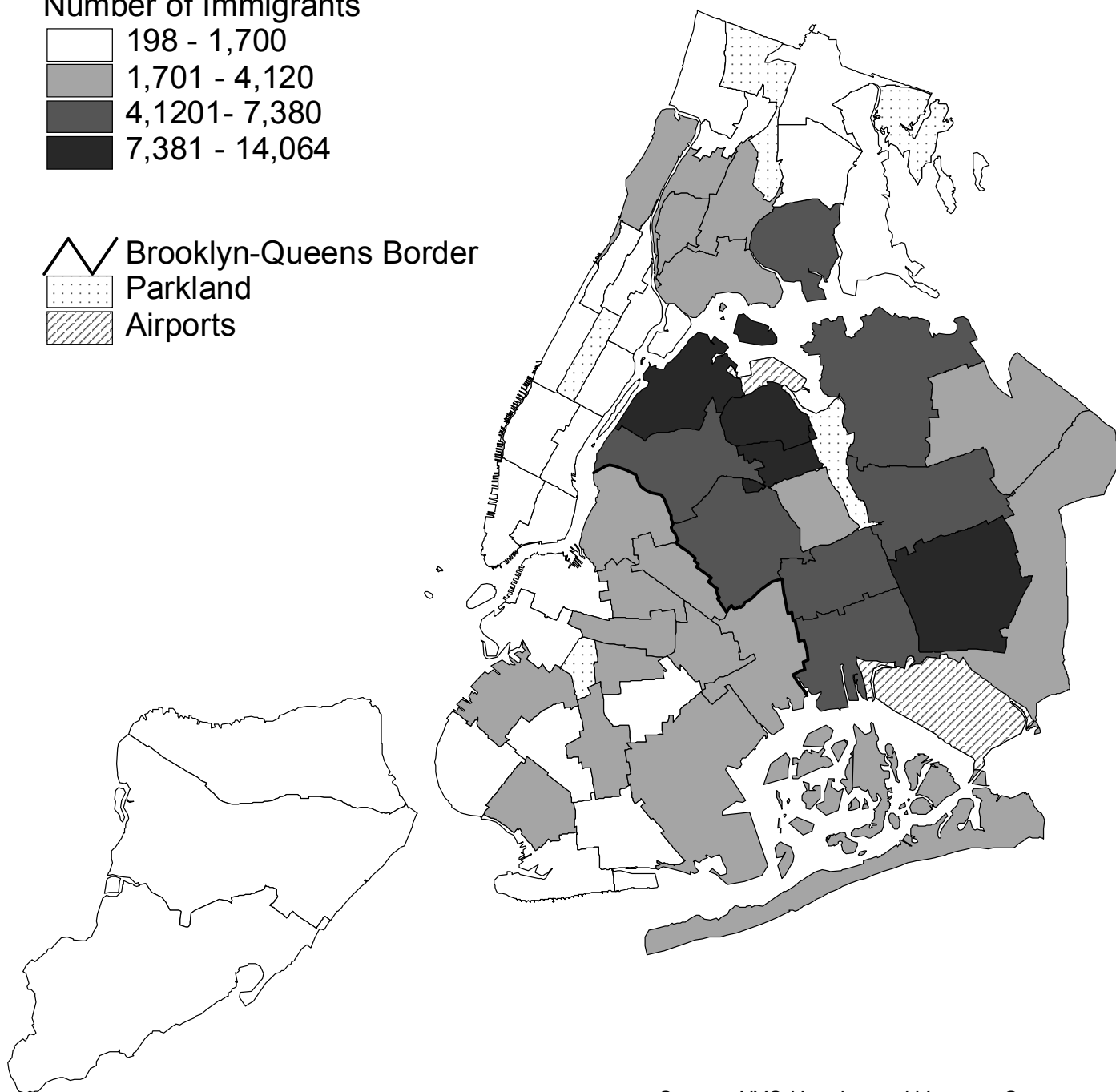

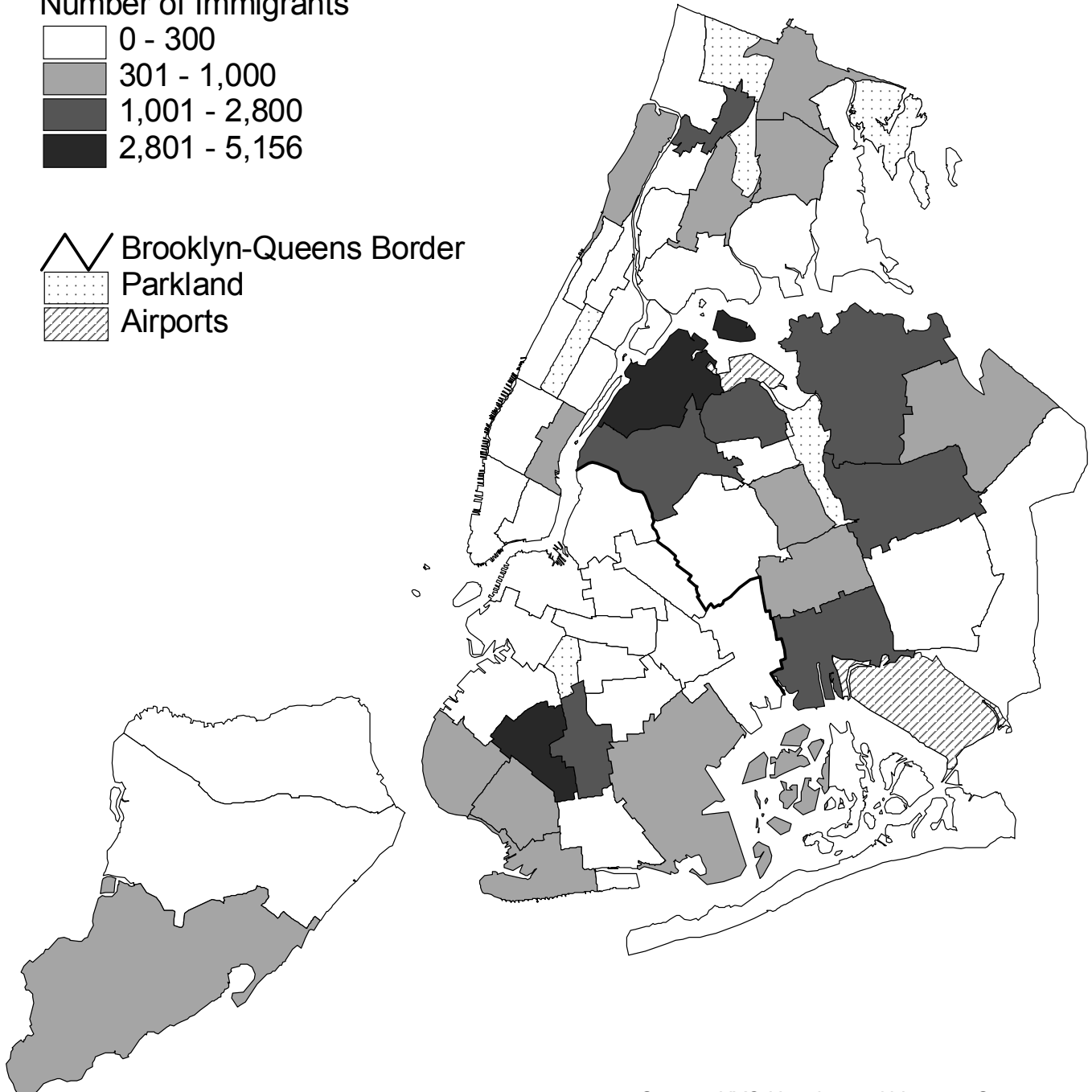
